Problem Based Learning takes your child on a journey of discovery. Children are presented with a problem in the community. They learn from experts in the field, field experiences and their own personal research. All of this knowledge fuels them to become a mini-expert in the field. They begin to develop solutions to the problem with a collaborative team. The team presents their solutions to a panel of experts in the field. The experts provide feedback and determine the viability of solutions. Next, staff determines which solutions are most viable to move forward.
